

# USE CARRDSS TO HELP YOU EVALUATE FREE WEBSITE SOURCES!

**C****REDIBILITY:** Who is the author? What are his or her credentials? Check the “About Us” link if needed. You may need to shorten the web address to investigate the root home page.

**A****CCURACY:** Can facts, statistics, or other information be verified through other sources? Based on your knowledge from database resources, does the information seem accurate?

**R****ELIABILITY:** Does the source present a particular view or bias? Bias is not necessarily bad, just be sure to seek the other side of the issue. Power tip: Find other websites that link to the page (yourURL) by searching for <link:yourURL>. You will see other sites that are using your page as a resource. Would you trust these sites?

**R****ELEVANCE:** Does this site directly help me with information or answer my questions?

**D****ATE:** When was this information created? When was it revised? Are these dates important when researching my topic?

**S****OURCES BEHIND THE TEXT:** Can you tell where the website’s author found their sources? Did the author use reliable, credible sources?

**S****COPE:** Does this site answer my questions or does it have trivial information? Is it a scholarly or popular treatment? Is this site trying to sell me something? Examine the web address for .com (commercial), .gov (government), .org (non-profit) or .edu (educational institution) – although beware, as these do not necessarily guarantee an accurate & ethical website.
